

Glanville Environmental Attains Membership of The Survey Association

Members undergo a rigorous application process over several weeks, which includes an assessment of technical skill based on project evidence; an in-depth interview; and submission of the company's financial performance. Finally, new members are granted formal acceptance by the Council.
